Ms. Reina Sims works with underserved, minority populations at the Ohio Commission on Minority Health, with a special focus on cardiovascular issues, cancer, diabetes, infant mortality, substance abuse, and violence. In her role as Program Manager, Ms. Sims works to ensure the Commission's funded preventive health measures, and multiple collaborative state agency partnerships, positively impact health outcomes for minority and vulnerable communities in her state.

Ms. Sims believes it is important to help shape policy to reach health equity. One way to achieve this is by using data to craft legislation that reduces health disparities and by leveraging stories and patient outcomes to build awareness and support policy changes.

I consider it my honor to be in a position that allows me to positively impact programming, policy and systems change for the betterment of not just my family's health and well-being, but for everyone disproportionately impacted by health disparities, and the social determinants that allow those disparities to persist.
